TOUR LEADER: DEBORAH TRESISE, LINGUA MUSICA

LINGUA MUSICA TOURS feature classical performance, ranging from grand European Music Festivals to more intimate ones, for example, the Duszniki Chopin Festival. Enjoy opera, ballet and symphony in the great European music houses, or savouring world class music performances in ancient castles and churches throughout Europe. Each year our route is a different one, though we return to our favourites many times. We also incorporate into our tours many additional activities of cultural and historical interest, such as visits to Art Galleries, walking tours, full day excursions, stimulating lectures and visits to the homes of composers.

Opera Magnifica is a magnificent tour incorporating summer opera festivals of Italy - the Verona, the Maggio Musicale Fiorentino and the Puccini, plus visits to some of the most beautiful opera theatres of Europe - Milan's Teatro La Scala and the Baths of Caracalla of Rome.

We will be indulging in breathtaking scenery, art, history and culture, visiting Italy's much loved major cities as well as the ancient regional towns of Lucca, Verona, Sirmione and San Gimignano. While the focus of our tour will be spectacular opera performance at Italy's most prestigious summer festivals, we will also be paying tribute to the Renaissance masters, Botticelli, Michelangelo and Raphael, and the Baroque geniuses Bernini and Borromini, artists and architects who had so much influence on the artistic development of this wonderful and inspiring country. We will be incorporating visits to both the major and lesser known cultural sites and artistic masterpieces in each location, such as Castello Sforzesco, The Vasari Corridor and the magnificent Villa d'Este, with its extensive cypress gardens and many fountains.

ITINERARY

Monday 9th July MILAN

Our tour commences in Milan, where we will we staying in the HOTEL MILANO SCALA situated in the Brera district, a few minutes' walk from Teatro alla Scala, the Galleria Vittoria Emanuele and the Duomo Milano. Our hotel is also a pleasant walking distance to one of Milan's most important galleries; the Pinacoteca di Brera, home to many masterpieces by leading Italian artists and the magnificent Castello Sforzesco, with its many museums and home to Michelangelo's last sculpture, the Rondanini Pietà. Meet fellow travellers later in the afternoon at our first tour meeting with Deborah Tresise, followed by a Welcome Dinner.

Tuesday 10th July MILAN

We commence our time in Milan with an early morning guided tour of this vibrant and artistic city, including a visit to Leonardo da Vinci's 'The Last Supper'*, situated in the Santa Maria Delle Grazie. (*pending availability)

After an afternoon at leisure we will meet for dinner before our opera performance at Teatro alla Scala, **Don Pasquale**, Giovanni Ruffini

Wednesday 11th July VERONA

We will take the afternoon train to the ancient Roman city of VERONA. Situated on the River Adige, Verona boasts ancient piazzas, forums and medieval castles. Our hotel in Verona will be the beautiful HOTEL GABBIA d'ORO, situated a minute's walk from Piazza Erbe. After relaxing at leisure, we will meet for dinner in our hotel before strolling to the ancient Verona Arena, originally built in the 1st century for gladiatorial conquest, for the first of our Verona Opera Festival performances, AIDA, Guiseppe Verde

Thursday 12th July VERONA

Our local guide will introduce us to Verona, visiting many of the cultural sites, such as the Casa di Giulietta with its legendary balcony, Lamberti Tower, some of Verona's Medieval churches, a visit to the beautiful Renaissance style Giardino Guisti with its spectacular views over Verona, and the 14th century Palazzo Giusti, home to several frescoes which are the work of Francesco Lorenzi & Lodovico Dorigny. After a leisurely afternoon we will meet for an evening meal prior to our second Verona Opera Festival performance.

EVENING PERFORMANCE: DON GIOVANNI, W. A. Mozart

Friday 13th July VERONA

This morning we will take a pleasant drive to the ancient and fortified town of SIRMIONE, situated on Lago di Garda. Sirmione has a beautiful historic centre and is home to Castello Scaligero, one of the finest examples of a medieval fortification, including the very rare fortified port. We will take lunch at one of the many delightful restaurants in the Sirmione centre and arrive back at our Lucca hotel in time for a late afternoon siesta and refreshments at your own leisure before our third and final festival performance.

We understand that some may prefer to take our last evening in Verona at their leisure; as such this evening's festival performance is OPTIONAL.

Saturday 14th July VENICE

This morning we take the comfortable 2 hour fast-train journey from Verona to VENICE. We will be staying at the very central and luxurious HOTEL BONVECCHIATI. Located in the heart of Venice, the Hotel Bonvecchiati has the most privileged position of any 4-star hotel in Venice: situated in Calle Goldoni, just a 3-minute walk from Saint Mark's Square and 5 minutes from the Rialto Bridge, the Rialto stop of the vaporetto that takes you to the Grand Canal. The Venice Lido is also 5 minutes away via vaporetto. After checking in and refreshments at your leisure, we will meet our local guide, who will introduce you to all those things people love about this unique and vibrant city. Our afternoon will include visits to several of the many cultural sites of Venice, including the beautiful Peggy Guggenheim museum. Our stay in Venice coincides with the annual Festa del Redentore, a religious festival dating back to 1577, in celebration of the city's deliverance from The Plague which swept through Europe with devastating results. At dusk this evening there will be traditional Venetian food served in Piazza San Marco, followed by a magnificent fireworks display which will illuminate the spires, domes and bell towers well into the night. Pending availability there may be the opportunity to attend additional classical performances at one of Venice's many Chiesa

Sunday 15th July VENICE

We will meet our guide early this morning for a guided visit to the wonderful **Accademia Gallery**, situated in the Scuola Grande of Santa Maria della Carità, on the Grand Canal. The Accademia is home to a very rich collection of Venetian paintings, from the Byzantine & Gothic 14th century, to the artists of the Renaissance, Bellini, Carpaccio, Giorgione, Veronese, Tintoretto and Tiziano until Gianbattista Tiepolo and the Vedutisti of the 18th century ... Canaletto, Guardi, Bellotto, Longhi.

The afternoon will be at leisure before meeting for dinner, after which we will stroll to an evening opera performance in the grand **Teatro alla Fenice**, one of Europe's most beautiful and romantic opera houses.

EVENING PERFORMANCE: L'ELISIR d'AMOUR, Donizetti

Monday 16th July VENICE

This morning we will take an excursion to the island of Morano in the Venetian Lagoon to visit the famous **Morano Glass** factory. Afternoon and evening at leisure.

Tuesday 17th July FLORENCE

This morning we will take the vaporetto to the Venice Mestre Rail Station, in time for our fast-train to FLORENCE, arriving in time for lunch in our hotel, the very centrally located **GRAND HOTEL MINERVA**. After a rest and refreshments we will enjoy an introductory guided walking tour of this artistic Renaissance city. We will meet for dinner before our evening performance, the delightful one act opera, **Gianni Schicchi** at the **Teatro Comunale Firenze**. The work is the third and final part of Puccini's Il Trittico. Gianni Schicchi has been received with great enthusiasm since its premier at New York's Metropolitan Opera in 1918.

Wednesday 18th July FLORENCE

Morning: Guided walk via the historic Ponte Vecchio to the Pitti Palace and gardens for a guided tour. The remainder of the day is your own, for further exploration or to enjoy a relaxing afternoon at our hotel's magnificent roof-top swimming pool and panoramic terrace from where you can take-in one of the world's most beautiful 360 degree views across the façade of the Church of Santa Maria Novella, the Duomo, Giotto's Bell tower and the Palazzo Vecchio.

This evening we will enjoy a choral performance at the historic Anglican Church of St Marks.

Thursday 19th July FLORENCE

Departing early, we will walk through the beautiful quieter streets of Florence to the Accademia Museum where we will meet our Guide. We will also visit the Medici Vasari Corridor*, which provides excellent views across Florence from its elevated passages which stretch from the Palazzo Vecchio to the Palazzo Pitti. (Pending availability.) The afternoon and evening will be free for independent wandering through this magical city with its endless Renaissance art and architecture, beautiful scenery and elegant shopping.

Friday 20th July LUCCA

This morning we take a pleasant drive through the Tuscan countryside in our private coach to the Medieval walled town of LUCCA, arriving in time for lunch at your leisure at one of the many elegant restaurants around Piazza Napoleone, home to a marble statue of Elisa Bonaparte Baciocchi, sister of Napoleone Bonaparte, who ruled Lucca from 1805 to 1815. The afternoon will be your own for a siesta or further exploration.

We will meet for dinner before our transfer to TORRE del LARGO for our first Puccini Festival performance, held in the open air theatre a short distance from the villa where the great composer lived and worked.

Saturday 21st July LUCCA

This morning we will take an excursion to the 10th century hill-top walled town of San Gimignano, situated some 350 m above sea level and dominating the Elsa Valley. Once the centre of 'Via Francigena', the flourishing trading and pilgrim's route, San Gimignano has an established cultural importance and is home to many 14th century paintings of the Sienese School and 15th century paintings of the Florentine School, examples of which can be seen in the Duomo and the Palazzo del Popolo. We will lunch at one of the many San Gimignano restaurants. We will return to Lucca in time for an afternoon siesta, before our second Puccini Festival performance, MADAMA BUTTERFLY, Giacomo Puccini.

Sunday 22nd July ROME

After a leisurely last morning in Lucca, we will return to Florence by private coach in time to catch the high speed train to ROME, arriving in the late afternoon. Our Rome hotel will be the beautiful and tranquil VICTORIA HOTEL ROMA, situated by the 2000 year old Aurelian Wall in the historical centre of Rome facing the beautiful Villa Borghese Gardens, just minutes walk from Via Veneto and Villa Borghese. The remainder of the day will be a restful one, giving you time to stroll through our hotel's marvelous surrounds. During our time in Rome we will see one or two operas of the Teatro Alla Roma, at the Baths of Caracalla where summer operas are staged, depending on their schedule. Dinner will be served beforehand.

Monday 23rd July ROME

This morning our guide will collect you from our hotel for a guided walking tour, introducing, or re-introducing you to Rome's most significant sights, including the Piazza di Spagna, Fontana di Trevi, Il Pantheon, Campo de' Fiori, Piazza Navona.

Tuesday 24th July ROME

Departing early, we will visit the UNESCO World Heritage site, Villa d'Este, Tivoli, set in splendid and mesmerising gardens of cypresses and fountains. Commissioned by Cardinal Ippolito II d'Este (1509-1572), son of Alfonso I d'Este and Lucrezia Borgia and grandson of Pope Alexander VI, the Villa d'Este is a masterpiece of Italian architecture and especially garden design. We will also visit the magnificent Hadrian's Villa, built as a private summer retreat for the Emperor of the same name between AD 118 and 134. Lunch will be included before returning to our hotel during the afternoon.

Wednesday 25th July ROME

Today we will take the metro further afield to **St Peter's Basilica**, **Vatican Museum** and **Sistine Chapel**, ending at **Castel Sant Angelo**, originally built as a mausoleum for the Emperor Hadrian (AD130-139). It is the famed setting for the last act of Puccini's Tosca. Here one can admire the beautiful views across Rome over coffee or cocktails in one of its rampart tower terraces. We will return to our hotel via the ancient **Trastevere** district, with its rich history and character, often referred to as the 'Village within the City'. In the evening we meet for our Farewell Dinner.

Wednesday 25th July ROME

Our wonderful Italian tour concludes after breakfast.
